About The New Cavendish Club

The VAD ladies' club - now the New Cavendish Club - was founded in 1920 by Lady Amptill - who had been Chairwoman of the Joint Women's VAD Department of the Order of St. John and the British Red Cross Society. It was created as a sanctuary and meeting place for those who had served with Voluntary Aid Detachments during the First World War providing welfare services to the sick and wounded at home at overseas.

The Nursing Memorial Appeal

The appeal has been set up in order to build a memorial to all nurses killed in both World Wars and to advance the education of nurses by providing a scholarship to enable them to study particular aspects of conflict and humanitarian aid.
